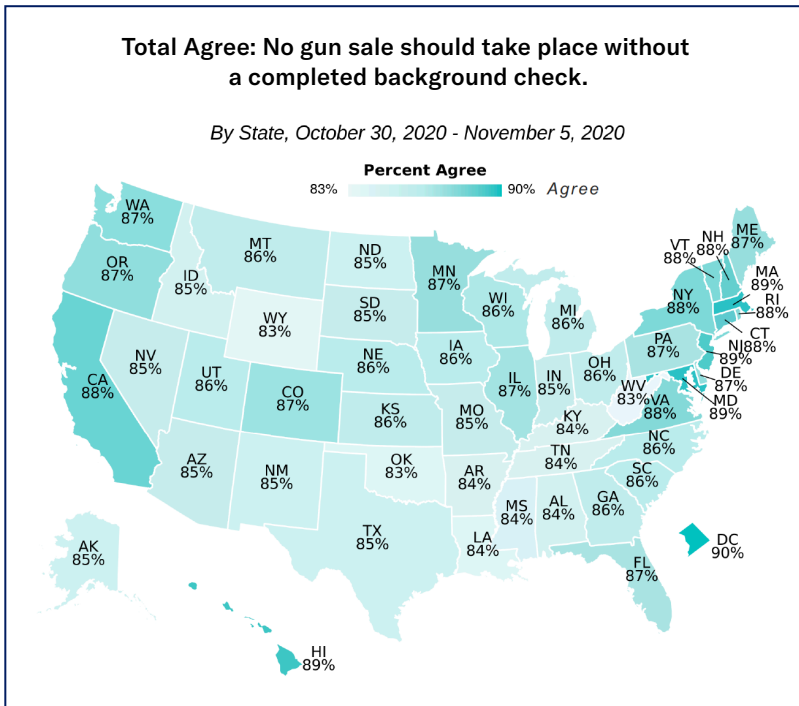


In all 50 states, the vast majority of voters support background checks.

More than four in five voters in every state in the country agree that no gun sale should take place without a completed background check.



Methodology

This poll was conducted by Morning Consult between October 30-November 4, 2020 among a national sample of 15,639 Voters. The interviews were conducted online, and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Voters based on age, gender, education, race, region, marital status, population density, home ownership, 2020 vote choice and 2020 vote mode (early/same-day). Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 1 percentage points.

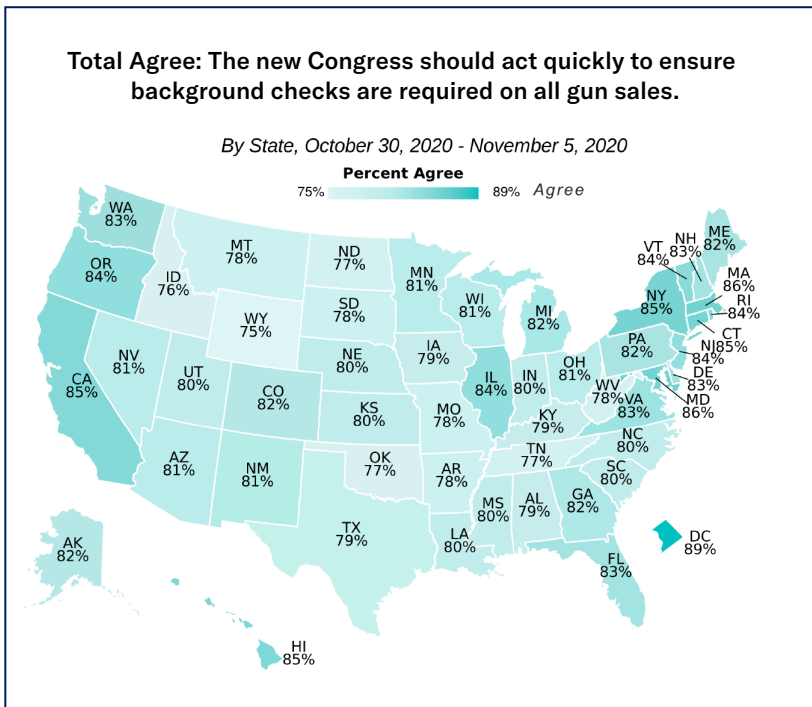
No gun sale should take place without a completed background check.

of Democrats agree that no gun sale should take place without a completed background check.

84%
of Independents agree that no gun sale should take place without a completed background check.

83%
of Republicans agree that no gun sale should take place without a completed background check.

Three-quarters or more of voters in every state agree that the new Congress should act quickly to ensure background checks are required on all gun sales.



Voters across the political spectrum strongly agree that no gun sale should take place without a completed background check.
